7. The Annual Subscription is Forty Shillings, post free, and is payable in advance.

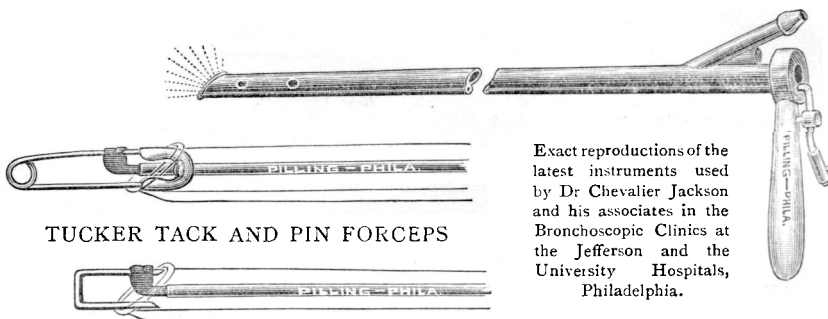
8. Single copies of back numbers, both of the present and the previous series, are on sale at Four Shillings each.
