



Practice in Direct Laryngoscopy, Tracheoscopy, Bronchoscopy, an Esophagoscopy will be given to Students, to enable them to become familia with the use and manipulation of the instruments.

Practitioners and Medical Students are admitted to the Practice of the Hospital at, a fee of five guineas for three months, eight guineas for six months, or te guineas for a Perpetual Studentship. Each course may commence at any dat Special terms to men in actual practice who can only attend the hospital once ( twice a week.

The Hospital contains 60 beds for In-patients. There is also an Out-patien

attendance of nearly 50,000 yearly.
