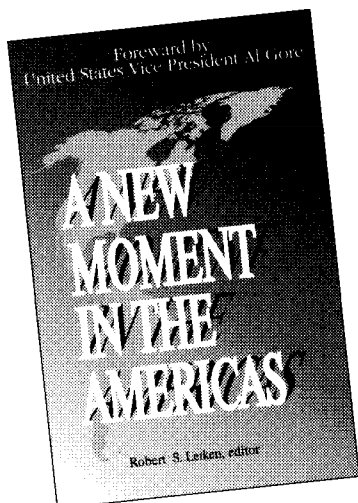

Amidst epochal changes elsewhere, the Western Hemisphere has undergone a major transformation of its own. Latin Americans and North Americans — long divided by differing cultural, historical, economic, and political perspectives — are finding more common ground. In late 1994, cultural and intellectual leaders of all political stripes from Latin America, the Caribbean, Canada, and the United States discussed their ideas of a New World culture. The fruits of that unprecedented “New Moment in the Americas,” contained in this volume of essays, shatter clichés about the hemisphere’s changing societies, politics, and cultures.
