The Struggle To Be Human is a foundational work which attempts to restore to human consciousness a more fundamental understanding of the conditions of social life, maintaining as it does that human survival and continuity are not insured by violence or power or institutions derived from the state or its certifying professions, but through human competencies and usefulness derived from cooperation and mutual aid.

The Struggle To Be Human emerges amidst the recurring failure of both academic and marxist sociologies to provide insight into ways in which we can live together harmoniously. It links the issues of social harm and punishment to scarcity and the basic human struggle to be free, and provides an incisive critique of the institutions of law, the state and certifying administrative systems. Also, it provides some historical insights into how both academic and marxian analyses, by their insistence upon the centrality of the State, continue to trade away the possibility of present human fulfillment and community for a managed, power-based existence.
