PUBLICATIONS

The Journal of Hellenic Studies is published annually and sent to all members of the Society. Members may choose to receive *Archaeological Reports* or *ARGO* (a bi-annual magazine, first published in 2015) or to top up their subscription to receive all three publications.

THE JOINT LIBRARY

The Society helps to maintain the Joint Library in conjunction with the Roman Society and the Institute of Classical Studies. Membership of the Hellenic Society allows the reader to borrow (within the UK) up to four books at a time, either in person or by post.

LECTURES
