## **OPEN ACCESS POLICIES**

## Green (self-archiving) Open Access

The Journal of the American Philosophical Association has one of the most liberal selfarchiving policies of any philosophy journal, allowing each author to post the accepted version of the paper on a personal or departmental webpage or in an institutional or other non-commercial repository upon acceptance (please see table below), without embargo. This forms part of the standard transfer of copyright.

This policy complies with all of the mandates on Open Access issued to date, including those of the US Office of Science and Technology Policy, the Australian Research Council, the EU Horizon 2020 program and HeFCE in the UK, as well as with the requirements of the Wellcome Trust, RCUK, HHMI, NIH and many other agencies, and with the AHRC's policies in respect of the next REF exercise (see note below).

In addition, authors may of course reproduce their article or an adapted version of it in any volume of which they are editor or author subject to normal acknowledgement, without requesting formal permission.

## FOR UK AUTHORS: NOTE ON AHRC/REF 2020 OPEN ACCESS REQUIREMENTS

From 1 April 2016, any articles published in J-APA which the author would like to be considered for submission to the next Research Excellence Framework (REF) exercise must be deposited in Accepted Manuscript form (see above) within a University or subject repository within 3 months of acceptance.

## **Gold Open Access**

The Journal of the American Philosophical Association also offers authors the option of making the published Version of Record freely available on the publisher's online platform upon publication, through the Cambridge Open Option program. For this option there is an Article Processing Charge currently set at \$2,700; this fee partially offsets the costs of publishing the paper. A variety of Creative Commons licenses are available.
