The fourth column includes dates for entries where the same word occurs earlier, but in a different sense (or word class) from the way it is used in Shakespeare. It is unclear just how much one of these uses might have influenced the Shakespearean one, but in all such cases it is evident that the word was in circulation and is thus unlikely to have been a Shakespearean invention (though it is of course always possible for more than one person to invent a word during the same time period). Dates of the works follow the listing in *Shakespeare's Words*. Only 32 per cent (554) of the entries have been updated. Total: 1,753.
