'Friends, Romans, countrymen, lend me your ears' -- The opening of Antony's funeral oration for Julius Caesar, which aimed 'to bury Caesar, not to praise him' is often studied for its persuasive rhetoric (3.2.82,83). This 1964 sketch by C. Walter Hodges emphasizes Antony's command of the stage by rendering his audience in loose strokes suggestive of movement, while creating a crisp figure for Antony himself.
