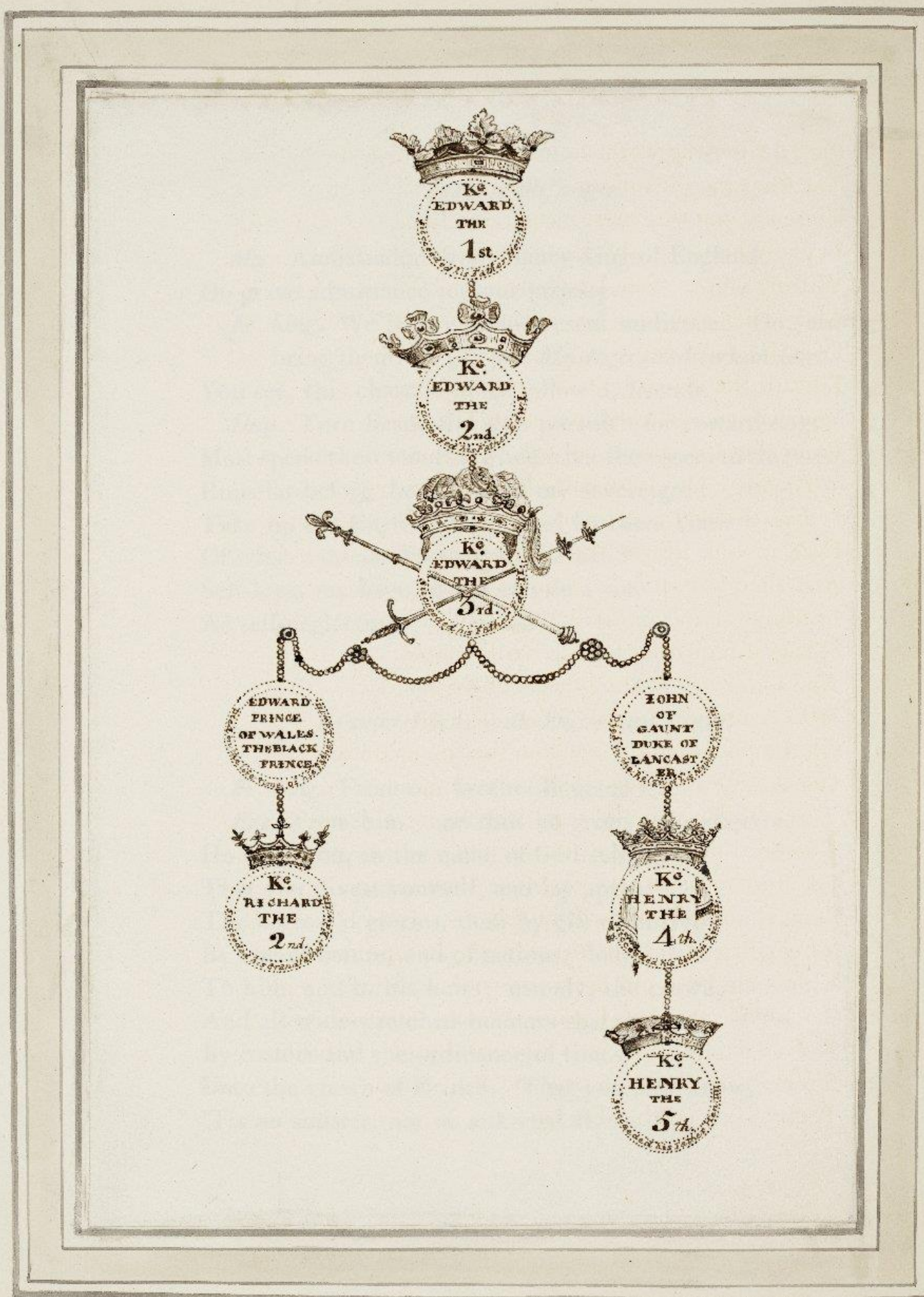

The added illustrations in this edition of *The Dramatic Works of Shakespeare* / revised by George Steevens (1803) were collected by George C. George of Penryn in the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. This genealogical table shows the relationship among the monarchs of Shakespeare's history plays, and was placed opposite p. 39 of *King Henry V*. It locates the eponymous monarch and his popular play as the descendent of Edward III.
