This set of drawings by Anthony C. Colborne depict several rarely-illustrated Shakespeare characters, including the Tailor from *The Taming of the Shrew* (upper right) and the Apothecary from *Romeo and Juliet* (lower left). A jaunty Petruchio at the upper left, perhaps the most well-known character today of the four identified, yields the largest center position to Abhorson, the executioner in *Measure for Measure*. Abhorson appears briefly in Act 4 to offer comic relief alongside Pompey the clown.
