Although first published some 33 years after *The Merchant of Venice*, Marlowe's *Jew of Malta* was likely an inspiration for Shakespeare's play. It was first performed between 1589-90 and features Barabas, who set the expectations for Jews on the English stage at the end of the sixteenth century.
