Charles Pitt (1768-1833) was one of the stage names of Charles Isaac Mungo Dibdin, who also performed as "Charles Dibdin the younger." During his early career, Dibdin toured in Dublin, Liverpool, and London; he eventually became the manager of Sadler's Wells Theatre in London in 1800. The musical and pantomime performances Dibdin promoted were popular with his spectacle-hungry public. After recovering from a stint in debtor's prison by selling his Sadler's Wells shares, he published poetry, drama, and his memoirs before his death in 1833. (Kilburn, Matthew.
