

Open Access Books: From Proposal to Publication

Author submits a book* proposal.

2

As with a non-OA book, rigorous peer review is carried out.

3

Author formally chooses to publish OA, contract is agreed and signed, and a Creative Commons licence is assigned to the book.

4

Book Processing Charge (BPC) is required, often covered by the author's institution or a funder.

5

Our standard copyediting and proofreading processes are implemented, and the book is produced.

6

Upon publication, the title is available immediately for download as PDF (full book & by chapter) and HTML via Cambridge Core, as well as further online indexing. The book is also available in print format.
