CALL FOR SPECIAL ISSUE PROPOSALS

(For the 2025 special issue)

Due December 8, 2023

The Editorial Board of the *Canadian Journal of Law and Society / Revue Canadienne Droit et Société* is seeking proposals for the 2025 special issue of the journal (Volume 40, Issue 2 or Issue 3). The annual thematic special issue, curated by guest editors, will be selected by the Editorial Board during the winter 2024. Each special issue explores a theme across a range of genres through contributions from a diverse group of scholars. The CJLS/RCDS is an interdisciplinary, peer-reviewed journal that publishes cutting-edge research on law and its social and cultural contexts.

Since January 2023, all issues of the journal have been fully open access and all articles are published with a non-exclusive Gold Open Access CC-BY licence (see <u>here</u> for more details). This means that all authors can now publish their articles open access without paying any fees. See this *FAQ* for more information.

Past Special Issues have included:

- 2024 Person-Centred Justice: Reimagining Law, Institutions and Process
- 2023 Pandemics and Paradigms of Governance: Futures of the Rule of Law in the 21st Century
- 2021 Democracy v. Democracy: Religious Rights by Way of Democratic Processes

Proposals by potential guest editors must comply with the CJLS/RCDS <u>Submission</u> guidelines for all authors interested in submitting manuscripts to the journal. See also our <u>Special Issue</u> <u>Guidelines</u> and <u>Schedule</u> on the journal <u>website</u>. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Proposals should be emailed to <u>cjls_rcds@carleton.ca</u> by December 8, 2023. Proposals should include both French and English contributions and, for the 2025 special issue, the Editorial Board is particularly interested in proposals featuring a significant number of French manuscripts.
